

# PROTOCOL Cleaning Equipment and Colour Coding

#### **Purpose**

To define which type of cleaning equipment may be used, the colour coding and the storage thereof

#### **Scope**

Manufacturing and non-manufacturing areas, and food and non-food contact areas

#### General

- Only approved lint free cleaning cloths may be used (lavettes)
- Wooden equipment is prohibited
- Avoid using hollow-handled tools especially in wet cleaned areas
- Metal scrapers should not be used on product contact surfaces to avoid damaging the equipment. If there is no alternative, a visual inspection must be completed to ensure that no damage to the equipment or scraper has occurred
- · Wire brushes must not be used
- The bristles of brushes used for equipment cleaning must be nylon
- Floor mops are not permitted for use on product contact surfaces
- Where possible, cleaning equipment must be engraved with contractor name

#### **Colour Coding of Cleaning Equipment**

#### **Drain Cleaning**

Dustcoat Black

Cloths Red chequered

Buckets Black

Brushes Black bristles with black end cap on handle Brooms Black bristles with black end cap on handle Scrapers Black plastic or stainless steel with black handle

Dustpan Black Wet floor sign Red

#### **Ablution Cleaning**

Dustcoat Red Cloths Red Buckets Red

Squeegees Red end cap on handle

Brooms Red bristles and red end cap on handle

Dustpan Red Wet floor sign Red

General Plumbing – Blue overall





## **Sanitation of Cleaning Equipment**

After use,

- Cleaning equipment must be cleaned and sanitized (if applicable) before storage.
- Cleaning equipment must be inspected for damage; especially loose bristles on equipment used on food contact surfaces and damaged mop threads

### **Storage of Cleaning Equipment**

- Equipment must be stored off the floor, whether in storage or in production
- The storage area must be well ventilated
- Equipment used for ablution cleaning and drain cleaning must be stored separately from other equipment
- Brooms and brushes must be stored head down
- Mop must be stored head up
- Equipment storage locations must be properly labelled to ensure that the equipment are stored in their designated areas
