

## **PROTOCOL Floor Drain Cleaning**

### **Purpose**

To describe how to clean floor drains in production areas without resulting in a cross-contamination risk

### **Scope**

Production and storage areas

### **Equipment**

Red chequered cloth  
Black plastic scrapers  
Black buckets  
Black brush  
Black grip squeegee

### **PPE**

Safety Shoes  
Rubber Gloves  
Black Dustcoat

### **Product**

Shureclean	1:100
Delladet sanitizer	1:100 ready to use in spray bottle

### **Dry Cleaning Instructions**

- Inspect drains on a daily basis, and if there is debris in the catch trap, basket or grate, remove to a refuse bag placed next to the drain
- Remember to use black colour coded equipment and dedicated overalls which must be change after working with drains
- Ensure that the catch trap is filled with water to prevent the release of drain odours
- Where production runs 24 hours a day for a full week, chlorine may be used to sanitise the drains during operation

### **Wet Cleaning Instructions**

- This must be scheduled when production in the area is not running
- Remember to use black colour coded equipment and dedicated overalls which must be change after working with drains
- Remove debris in the catch trap basket or grate and place in a refuse bag next to the drain
- Brush clean the covers, pot and drain baskets on both sides using detergent
- Rinse
- Sanitize by applying the diluted sanitizer over the assembled drain to cover the catch trap
